### TIM FOX 1936 - 2023

It was sad to see the passing of Tim in October 2023. I first met Tim Fox in the 1980s at Ritchies Mill in Patterson Street where the LAS had its home base. Tim and his wife Marie were both born in Ireland and he trained as a traditional master painter, a meticulous skill he translated into his paintings of landscapes and portraits.

A successful exhibition in 1986 held at Ritchies Mill - 'Showcase 7' with seven members of LAS. This was the last exhibition held at Ritchies Mill before a major facelift and new board of management took over in December 1986.

Tim was also very active in the Tasmanian Abstract and Contemporary Artists Group (TACA), a statewide group focused on abstract art, and he was a great contributing member to all the exhibitions held in many galleries around Tasmania during the 1980s and 90's.

Tim was very interested in portrait painting and for a time he belonged to a group, (some were LAS members) who met at a small hall in upper Frankland Street and painted a variety of sitters.

After retirement he and Marie developed an audio testing business that took them around Tasmania. He was a very active and prolific gardener and took great delight in his thriving garden. He and his wife Marie travelled back to Ireland fairly regularly to visit their large families living there.


