

Expressive Portrait Drawing from Photos and from Life



Saturday 18 May, 10.00am - 4pm

In this workshop, the focus will be on having fun whilst building confidence and skills drawing portraits both from photos and from life. We will be building on to the skills and knowledge covered in last year's portraiture workshop, although participation in that workshop is not a prerequisite.

The morning's activities will include exercises to familiarize yourself with a process that helps you confidently draw a head from any perspective. We will discuss the tip, the tilt and the turn of the head, centre lines, placement of features down and across the face, lighting and shadow shapes, and a simple way to tone and then render a face to create on a 2-D surface the illusion of a 3-dimensional head. In addition, if using pastel pencils, we will discuss how you can 'turn form' (make it look more 3-D) by using temperature changes -not just value changes.

Participants can use either charcoal or pastel pencils or sticks in this workshop. Clare will

demonstrate in both mediums, and participants will have time in the morning session to try both.

The afternoon session will be an opportunity to work from a live model who will model one long pose for us under controlled lighting. Working from life offers its own challenges, but is the best way to learn and see what to draw, and how to 'say' it. It is the best way to build into your drawings and paintings your emotional response to the subject. It is Clare's hope that participants will find (when comfortable with their tools and a process that works for them), that working on portraits from life allows for greater personal expression and can be immensely rewarding.



A huge thank you to all who completed our Member Survey asking about your opinion of our Newsletter and Website.


It seems that our members are overwhelmingly happy with both, stating that the newsletter and website are both professional and useful.
